Primary Duties and Responsibilities

The following information is not meant to be all-inclusive. Other duties and responsibilities may be assigned as necessary.

All psychology adjunct faculty at Alverno College collaborate in curriculum development, teaching, learning and assessment, and program evaluation within Psychology and the curriculum at large. Primary duties and responsibilities include:

- Teach a range of courses in our Master of Science in Community Psychology program. These courses will be mainly counseling-focused, including assessment and interviewing skills as well as some advanced classes.
- Assess student and program learning outcomes.
- Develop and revise curriculum.
- Engage in ongoing professional development.
- Engage in scholarship activities related to teaching and counseling practice.
- Actively participate in national counseling organizations.

Qualifications

1. Master's Degree required; doctorate preferred.
2. Significant clinical experience and licensure at the LPC or psychologist level.
3. Strong communication skills with faculty, staff, students, and potential students.

4. Must have demonstrated leadership abilities and an understanding of student development, including the ability to balance student needs and take on an institutional perspective.
5. Strong commitment to quality teaching in the liberal arts and to the social justice mission of the college
6. Experience teaching diverse learners using inclusive practices.
7. Requires the ability to work in a team setting and work effectively with a variety of audiences and departments.
8. Requires strong organizational skills and the ability to multi-task and prioritize.
9. Must be able to work evenings and weekends as necessary.
