5.	Start by placing the computer flat on the desk or table with the back facing you so you can see the connections.	
	 A. Mouse B. Keyboard C. Ethernet Cable (blue or black) D. Speakers (green port) E. Monitor (depending upon the color of the plug at the end of your cable it could be either of the two labeled E.) F. Power Cord 	
	For each piece the plug will only go in one way, so don't force it if it doesn't go in easily. Instead, turn it around and try again.	
	Now you can plug the other end of the power cord into the wall outlet or power strip.	
6.	Do the same for the monitor power cord and place the monitor where you prefer. (see images for two possible options for placement)

 7. Your last step will be to physically connect your computer and phone to the Alverno network. Begin by locating the wall plate that contains the wall jacks for both data (computer) and voice (analog phone). One should be labeled data on the jack while the other will be labeled voice. (another hint: A network jack is different than a phone jack by the numbers /letters above it. Example: Network – LA2-B06 Phone – LA2-010 The last 3 characters for a network jack will have a letter and numbers. The last 3 characters for a phone jack will only have numbers.) 	
 8. If you have an analog phone you will want to plug the ethernet cable (<i>blue or black in color</i>) coming from your computer into the data jack. Your analog phone will be plugged into the other voice jack.
