The School Psychology Educational Specialist (Ed.S.) Program seeks applicants for a full-time ten month faculty position as an Assistant Professor beginning in the 2020-2021 academic year. This is an exciting opportunity to be involved in the development of a program that launched in 2018. The position is a full time, faculty exempt position. Salary and academic rank will be commensurate with qualifications, education, and experience. Primary Duties and Responsibilities

All School Psychology faculty at Alverno College collaborate in curriculum development, teaching, learning and assessment, and program evaluation within School Psychology and the curriculum at large. Primary duties and responsibilities include:

- Teach a range of courses in our Educational Specialist (Ed.S.) in School Psychology program as well as in other departments including psychology and education, as needed.
- Advise graduate students as needed.
- Serve and collaborate in departmental and cross-departmental committees.
- Engage in scholarship activities related to teaching and school psychology.
- Active engagement in the field of school psychology.
- Commitment to recruiting and training students of color and/or populations that are typically underrepresented in the field of school psychology

Successful candidates will have a demonstrated commitment to promoting diversity, inclusion, and multicultural competence in an educational and work environment and must be willing to contribute to the College’s strategic plan of inclusion.

Qualifications and Education

- PhD with a School Psychology specialization required, with graduation from a NASP-accredited program.
- Licensed (or license eligible) as a School Psychologist or a Psychologist.
- Experience as a School Psychologist is preferred.
