Alverno College's NASP-accredited School Psychology Educational Specialist (Ed.S.) Program seeks applicants for a full-time ten-month faculty position as an Assistant Professor beginning the 2024-2025 academic year. This is an exciting opportunity to join an innovative program committed to issues of racial, cultural, and linguistic diversity. Alverno's School Psychology Program recently received 2.89 million dollars from the Department of Education to develop a multicultural school psychology training program that all Ed.S. students will complete. This certificate program trains both monolingual and bilingual students (and practitioners) in best practices for serving multilingual students and will be launched Summer 2024. In addition, to address school psychologist shortages in rural and remote parts of the state, all courses in the program structure has been successful in attracting a diverse group of highly qualified individuals working in education and related fields to join the profession.

The School Psychology Educational Specialist (Ed.S.) Program seeks applicants for a full-time ten month faculty position as an Assistant Professor of School Psychology beginning in fall of 2024 with opportunities for adjunct teaching beginning in summer of 2024. The position is a full time, faculty exempt position. Salary and academic rank will be commensurate with qualifications, education, and experience. Alverno College health, disability, and retirement plan enrollment is available to full time employees and eligible dependents. Tuition benefits are available for employees and qualified dependents. In addition, Alverno has a daycare on campus that gives priority enrollment to students, faculty, and staff. Full-time faculty are also provided the opportunity to teach during the summer or provide doctoral student mentorship for additional compensation.

Primary Duties and Responsibilities

All School Psychology Program faculty at Alverno College collaborate in curriculum development, teaching, learning and assessment, and program evaluation within the field of school psychology and the program at large. Primary duties and responsibilities include:



- Teach a range of courses in our Educational Specialist (Ed.S.) in School Psychology Program.
- Assist with continual assessment and improvement of the program.
- Advise graduate students as needed.
- Serve and collaborate in departmental and cross-departmental committees.
- Engage in scholarship activities related to teaching and school psychology.
- Demonstrate leadership in the field of school psychology through research activities, engagement with the community, and conference attendance.
- Must commit to recruiting and training students of color and/or populations that are typically underrepresented in the field of school psychology

Qualifications and Education

- PhD with a School Psychology specialization required, with preference for graduation from a NASP- and/or APA-accredited program.
- Licensed (or license eligible) as a School Psychologist
- Experience as a School Psychologist is preferred.

Successful candidates will have a demonstrated commitment to promoting diversity, inclusion, and multicultural competence in an educational and work environment and must be willing to contribute to the College's strategic plan of inclusion.
