- Assess students based on course learning outcomes.
- Develop and revise curriculum as needed and in collaboration with the program director.
- Complete all required course reporting and administration.
- Use Alverno's course management system to share course resources and assess student work.

Qualifications

The successful candidate will be an individual with undergraduate teaching experience, as well as a familiarity with political activism and getting young people involved in activism. A commitment to teaching within an innovative, outcome-based curriculum is required.

In addition, the following qualifications are sought for all Adjunct faculty:

- Strong communication skills with faculty, staff, students, and potential students.
- Must have demonstrated leadership abilities and an understanding of student development, including the ability to balance student needs and take on an institutional perspective.
- Strong commitment to quality teaching in the liberal arts and to the social justice mission of the college.
- Must be able to work during times when courses are scheduled.
