Academic Assessment and Progress Monitoring: in which graduate students will learn to administer standardized academic achievement and developmental tests including the WJ-IV, WIAT-III, and BDI-2. Students will be introduced to progress monitoring tools, processes, and methods to engage in data-based decision making. Students will also learn to use assessment data to inform academic-based interventions.

Qualifications and Education

- Well-developed knowledge and background in academic assessment and progress monitoring
- Knowledge of assessment and progress monitoring instruments used in a school setting, including the WJ-IV, WIAT-III, and BDI-2
- Minimum of an Educational Specialist’s degree in School Psychology
- Experience as a School Psychology is preferred
